At the end of this path turn right onto a farm track and continue to the end. Now turn right on the Tarland – Aboyne road and after a short distance turn left back onto the original way-marked path and back to your start point.

TARLAND

Tomnaverie Walk

Distance ➤ 2.5 km (1.5 mile)
Time ➤ 60 minutes
Grade ➤ easy/moderate




A short walk to a historic monument with fine views of the Howe of Cromar and St. Moluag's Church.

Start in the main square in Tarland and turn right onto Bridge Street, cross the road at bridge and take the footpath signed to "Stone Circle". This path borders a field and newly planted beech trees. Soon it reaches the Aboyne - Tarland road. Cross with care and enter the gate. Follow this path towards the stone circle.

A gate further uphill gives access to a new path leading to the circle. After visiting the circle and imagining the landscape changes that have taken place in the 4,000 years that man has lived in these parts. Retrace your steps and return to a gate, turn left and follow the direction post across some rough ground. The way marked route goes through a field and downhill to a path, follow it around the side of a small wood.





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
