You will pass the golf Course on your right and old ruined church on your left. You will soon come into the Village Square for refreshments before heading back to the Church car park.

Alastrean Walk

Grade ➤ moderate




A pleasant low level walk through mixed woodland and open countryside.

From the St. Moluag's Church car park follow the green way markers into the woodland. Turn right and continue easterly and meet a tarmac road to Alastrean. Follow the way markers and you will soon leave the trees at the easterly end of the wood and then proceed to the bridge across the small burn.

Proceed up through the newly planted 'Beech Beltie', a significant local landscape feature. At the top turn right along the tarmac road and through the farm buildings at Oldtown.

Descend from here to enjoy the fine views of the Howe of Cromar to join the Tarland-Coull road. Turn right here and follow the road back to Tarland.





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
